Today's whole school assembly was led by Arielle our Y5 pupil who has taken a deep interest in the events to mark this important date in history and was keen to talk to the pupils about it. Thank you very much Arielle for your thoughtful presentation! We reflected on the bravery of the veterans now approaching 100 years old whom moved many at the events these last few days. Children particularly noticed how the veterans focussed on the desire for peace and the hope that the end of World War II was meant to mark peace in Europe. We thought about wars in Europe today and hoped we could find peace in the near future.

Children and smartphones
