Fluoride Varnish at Gillespie Primary School


Dear Parents/Carers

The Whittington NHS Community Dental Fluoride varnish team will be visiting your child's school next week to see children in year groups.

Nursery-Year 2 for fluoride varnish application on

Thursday ,11th July 2024

Your child receieved a form and cover letter to take home ,you must fill and return the form to the school office as soon as possible before this date.



Specially trained dental nurses apply the varnish to children's teeth using a soft brush.

Why is Fluoride Varnish applied to teeth?

Fluoride varnish provides extra protection against tooth decay when used in addition to toothbrushing with fluoride toothpaste.

It is strongly recommended for children from the age of 3 years, to have fluoride varnish applied twice every year*. The fluoride varnish application can be applied at school and/or at their regular dentist.

Are there any reasons why it might not be applied at school?

• If your child has asthma /severe allergies / carries an Epi-Pen

• If your child is unwell or has sore areas in their mouth on the day. Please ask their regular dentist about having it at the dental surgery

Please ensure you enrol your child by filling out and returning the blue consent forms to the school ahead of our visit. The form has an FAQ (frequently asked questions) section.

Top tips for good oral health

- Brush your teeth twice a day with a fluoride toothpaste. Spit don't rinse!
- Reduce the frequency and quantity of sugary foods and drinks.
- Visit your dentist regularly (Scan the QR code to find an NHS Dentist)
