
Science Committee Engineering Event

On Wednesday, the Gillespie Science Committee worked extremely hard to deliver an Engineering event for the whole school and parent community. They spent a number of weeks planning and testing out ideas for it.

The pupils arrived at 8:15 for their weekly committee meeting and started setting up. They led differentiated activities throughout the day for pupils from Nursery through to Year 5 and then for parents from 3:30 – 4:30. There was information on hand about different types of engineers including aerospace engineer, structural engineer, civil engineer, boat builder, renewable energy engineer, electronic

engineer and automotive engineer. Activities included the following: making a boat to float, rocket mice, film canister rockets, cup towers, bridge building, wind turbines, catapults, testing passwords, balloon rockets, balloon buggies, paper aeroplanes, spinners, and investigating strong shapes. A good time was had by all.

I was absolutely astounded by what the science committee members achieved on Wednesday. Over half the committee are in Key Stage One! The leadership and communication skills; as well as, stamina and enthusiasm they demonstrated went far beyond my expectations. Congratulations Science Committee on an outstanding achievement and thank you to the school community for getting involved; having fun and providing your kind feedback.









### **Eco-Committee and STEMAZING Club Marine Awareness Event**

On Tuesday, our Eco-Committee and STEMAZING Club pupils did a grand job of raising the school community's awareness of the range of beautiful marine animals in our oceans and of how we need to avoid littering so that harmful plastic and other rubbish does not end up in our waterways. They provided information about a variety of animals which our school community enjoyed colouring in and drawing. The pupils came up with their own ideas for activities which included Pin the Tail on the Whale and removing plastic from a marine habitat. Pupils created their own stickers with messages for participants.

In addition, pupils helped me to create delicious ocean-themed snacks at school and families donated treats which we sold at our stall to raise money for the Ocean Conservation Trust. Thank you very much to those families who made this extra effort. We raised a whopping £132.40.
