Gillespie Smartphone Survey

Thank you very much to those who took part in the Gillespie School Smartphone Survey at the end of the last academic year. You can see a summary of the results <u>here</u>.

Results showed that while 85 per cent of Gillespie students do not have smartphones, 70 per cent of parents/carers said they would be interested in more information on the topic - particularly regarding child development and smartphones, cyber security and using social media in a positive way.

I recently met with Year 2 parents Mary and Victoria to discuss the survey results and agree on next steps. As the survey results confirm this is an issue that the Gillespie community would like to discuss further, we are in the early stages of developing a plan for a future event focused on the above topics. 



Ways to Support Friends of Gillespie & the school community

As we settle into the new term and FoG kick starts its efforts to support the school community, committee members have reflected on the conversations that they have had with parents, carers and staff about how individuals can support what FoG does and the need for us to share more information. With that in mind, here is a simple breakdown of the options available to those that wish to do so:

- 1. <u>Financial donations</u>: This seems like an obvious one, but the value of consistent direct donations to FoG (and by extension the school) cannot be overstated. With a steady and consistent flow of funding coming in, rather than the surge that we see following a fundraising event, we are able to engage in more long-term planning and delivery. This means smarter investments in key areas and ensures a healthy financial position for FoG for the foreseeable future.
 - A monthly direct debit donation of any amount you choose can be set up here in less than 5 mins, or you can use this QR code to access the site. As an example, if just half of the families at Gillespie contributed the cost of a cup of coffee on a weekly basis, FoG would raise an extra £20,000 a year!



3. <u>Time donations</u>: The FoG 'to-do' list is a never-ending one, and often it is simply about having the time and people-power to get things done.
