Attendance and punctuality policy changes

As mentioned in last week's newsletter, many of the school's safeguarding policies have been updated including our attendance and punctuality policy; taking account of the School Attendance Regulations 2024. Changes include arrangements for penalty notices, children absent or missing from education, daily absence sharing with the DfE (Department for Education) and absence coding. Full details can be found in the policy.

Important reminders

Good attendance at school is the single most important factor in ensuring that children and young people have the best opportunities in adult life. The class with the best weekly attendance will be celebrated in assembly as well as having awards and prizes at the end of the year.

The information below shows how attendance can affect your child's future progression.

Above 97%: Less than 6 days absence a year (12 sessions)

Excellent attendance! These young people will almost certainly get the best grades they can, leading to better prospects for the future. Pupils will also get into a habit of attending school which will help in the future.

95%: 10 days absence a year (20 sessions)

These pupils are likely to achieve good grades and form a habit of attending school regularly. Pupils who take a 2 week absence every year can only achieve 95% attendance.

90%: 19 days absence a year (38 sessions)

The Government classes young people in this group as "Persistent Absentees", and it will be almost impossible to keep up with work. Parents of young people in this group could also face the possibility of legal action being taken by the Local Authority.

Absence from school

Where children have minor coughs and colds, parents are encouraged to bring them to school and will be contacted for pick up where minor conditions develop and worsen. For prolonged absence due to illness, parents/carers may be asked to provide the school with medical evidence such as an appointment card, hospital letter or a recent prescription. Families are responsible for notifying the office by call or email before 9am if a child will be absent, including the reason for absence. The Islington & Whittington booklet on Minor illness and school attendance: A guide for parents and carers has useful information on childhood illness.

Parents/carers should make every effort to ensure appointments are made outside of school hours. Where this is not possible, they should get the school's agreement in advance and the pupil should only be out of school for the minimum amount of time necessary for the appointment. Parents are encouraged to make appointments during the school day if absolutely necessary, between 9.30 and 1.00 to minimise recorded absences from school.

The school will not authorise leave in term time unless under exceptional circumstances – for which you must apply using an 'application for leave form' obtained from the office in advance.



Punctuality

School begins at **8:55am** at which time the sunflower will be brought out in to the playground. Children should quickly and sensibly make their way to their classroom ready to start their morning learning. Please support your child by ensuring they have all the equipment they need for their day including bag, water bottle, instrument if applicable etc. Children who arrive after 9:05am will need to sign in at the school office.

Every school day counts BUT every minute is equally important!
