makes us tick, our likes and dislikes, strengths, fears, hopes and dreams. Our emotions play a key role in telling us just that, and being aware of how to listen to and express ourselves is a major part of building self-awareness. It is through knowing ourselves and speaking with others, that we can build resilience, grow and develop. 1 in 5 children and young people now have a probable mental health condition.



By taking part in Children's Mental Health Week 2025 it can help us to ensure that children feel listened to, and know that they're not alone. From Bear hugs in Reception to Dealing with your Inner Bully in Year 4 and 5 we all learnt the importance of our well-being and being mentally healthy.

This was all thanks to our new titled TfL Explorers who have been lots of events about active travel. They got to see his skills in action as well as having a go themselves.
