Reception Germ Lesson: British Science Week

Reception Class have been reading a book about germs. Leading up to, and during British Science Week, I visited Reception class and was really impressed to hear what they could recall about germs from what they have been read. We undertook an activity to show how germs spreads. We used baby oil to represent sweat on our hands and glitter (which will not be purchased again once used up) to represent germs. The pupils saw how germs spread when they clapped and shook hands and touched the table. They were able to tell me how to get rid of the germs by washing their hands with soap and warm water.



Key Stage One STEM Club: British Science Week

This week our STEM Club pupils had a go at making static slime by mixing cornflour and vegetable oil together. Next, we rubbed balloons on our hair to create static and then held the slime near the balloon. It was really fun to see the slime move towards the balloon. This is because it has a positive charge, while the charged balloon has a negative charge. The positive charge is attracted to the negative charge.



Eco-Committee

Our Gillespie Eco-Committee are enjoying watching the progress of our broad beans. They are now flowering. We had a pesky caterpillar who was delighting in munching on our plants so it has been moved to another section of the school playground. The pupils made labels for the broad beans and for the rocket they are growing in Lab_13. They have been tying the broad beans to bamboo poles as they grow.
